

Dear Friends,

I am honored to return to Camillus House after six years. This is the place that trained me and taught me the special blend of compassion and pragmatism needed when approaching a complex issue like homelessness. At the core, you must be deeply rooted in mission. Ours is rooted in the spirit of St. John of God who sought to offer the "poor, homeless, and those that had lost their minds" compassion and hospitality. That is Camillus House. We serve the poor, the homeless, and those that need to recover their mental health and/or overcome addiction to elevate their lives.

Miami has changed a great deal since I left and came back. Our Magic City has firmly established itself as a de facto Mecca for all things new, beautiful, and expensive. While this is good for the economy, it also creates pressure on families, seniors, and individuals who were just hanging on and now face eviction or have become homeless. The impact of this affects us all. As John Donne once wrote: "Any man's death diminishes me, because I am involved in mankind."

As always, Camillus House stands in the gap during this time of need. Be it major economic shifts, political changes, pandemics, or hurricanes, Camillus House has always stepped up to provide direct service such as showers, clothing, and food to people living in the streets. More than 1,600 sleep under one of our roofs across 11 residential locations in Miami-Dade every night. We provide, in addition to food, clothing, showers and shelter, mental health and substance abuse treatment, job training and placement, counseling, rental and utility assistance, and primary health care.

Regrettably, the cost of providing all of these services continues to skyrocket and, as always, we rely on the generosity of friends and partners like you. You make the difference! As our City continues to evolve, we need your help to ensure that Camillus will be able to meet the growing demand so that no one is diminished or forgotten.

I want to thank our recently retired CEO, Hilda M. Fernandez, and our former Chairman Paul Lowenthal for their service to Camillus House over the previous six years and during most of fiscal year 2024. I am honored to have been appointed CEO of such a historic and meaningful organization in late September of this year. And I am just as thrilled to serve under the leadership of our new Chairman, Albert Molina — a twenty-year veteran of our Board of Directors, a man of great character and faith.



FY 2024 Source of Funds




Operating Revenues Type

Planned Giving Donors

Camillus House successfully expanded its Planned Giving efforts to meet the growing demand for our programs—from our Day Center to permanent supportive housing. As a result, we've seen more donors including us in their wills or revocable living trusts, leaving part of their estate to both their loved ones and Camillus House, and joining our **Legacy Society**. The Legacy Society honors donors who support homeless services in Miami-Dade through planned gifts to Camillus House. Contributions, regardless of size, can be made via wills, trusts, life insurance policies, retirement plans, gift annuities, lead and remainder trusts, retained life estates, and similar vehicles.

Under this initiative, donors can make a bequest by:

- Allocating a set amount of cash, securities, or property
- Designating a percentage of their estate. This approach ensures their gift remains proportionate regardless of how the estate's value fluctuates over time.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to our Legacy Society members for their vision and leadership in providing long-term support to feed the hungry and shelter the homeless in our community.



We offer substance abuse treatment through our CARFaccredited and DCF-licensed Institute of Success and Personal Achievement. Currently, 59% of participants complete the program successfully, clean, sober and ready to reenter society.

1,180 Clients Served We offer rental support and emergency assistance to families at risk of eviction due to rising rents or unexpected circumstances. By covering rent and basic bills, we prevent homelessness. We also run the County's Homeless Prevention Hotline for urgent help.

Our programs train individuals in high-demand fields like culinary arts, construction and security. We partner with Miami-Dade College, Florida International University, and Barry University to offer career certifications. With a 70% job placement rate and competitive starting salaries, we provide a path out of poverty and homelessness.


